Six robot dogs that I once knew,

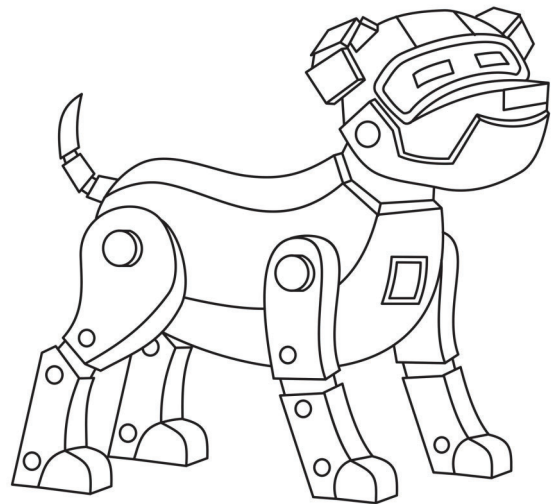
Tall ones, short ones, shiny ones too.

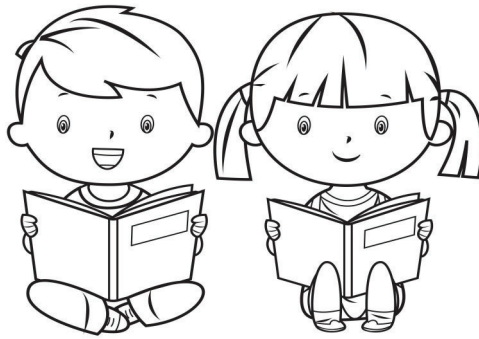

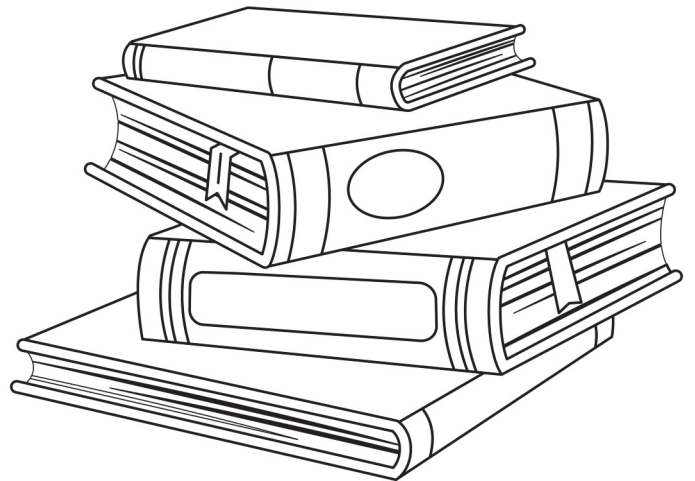

# Every Child Ready to Read Skill

## Write

Children need many opportunities to use their hands and fingers before they learn to write. Play provides a great opportunity for kids to develop these needed skills. Pointing out written letters and words on signs during outings help children understand that letters and print have meaning. Allow time for children to share fingerplays and play with playdough. This helps develop the strength and coordination needed for learning to write letters.
