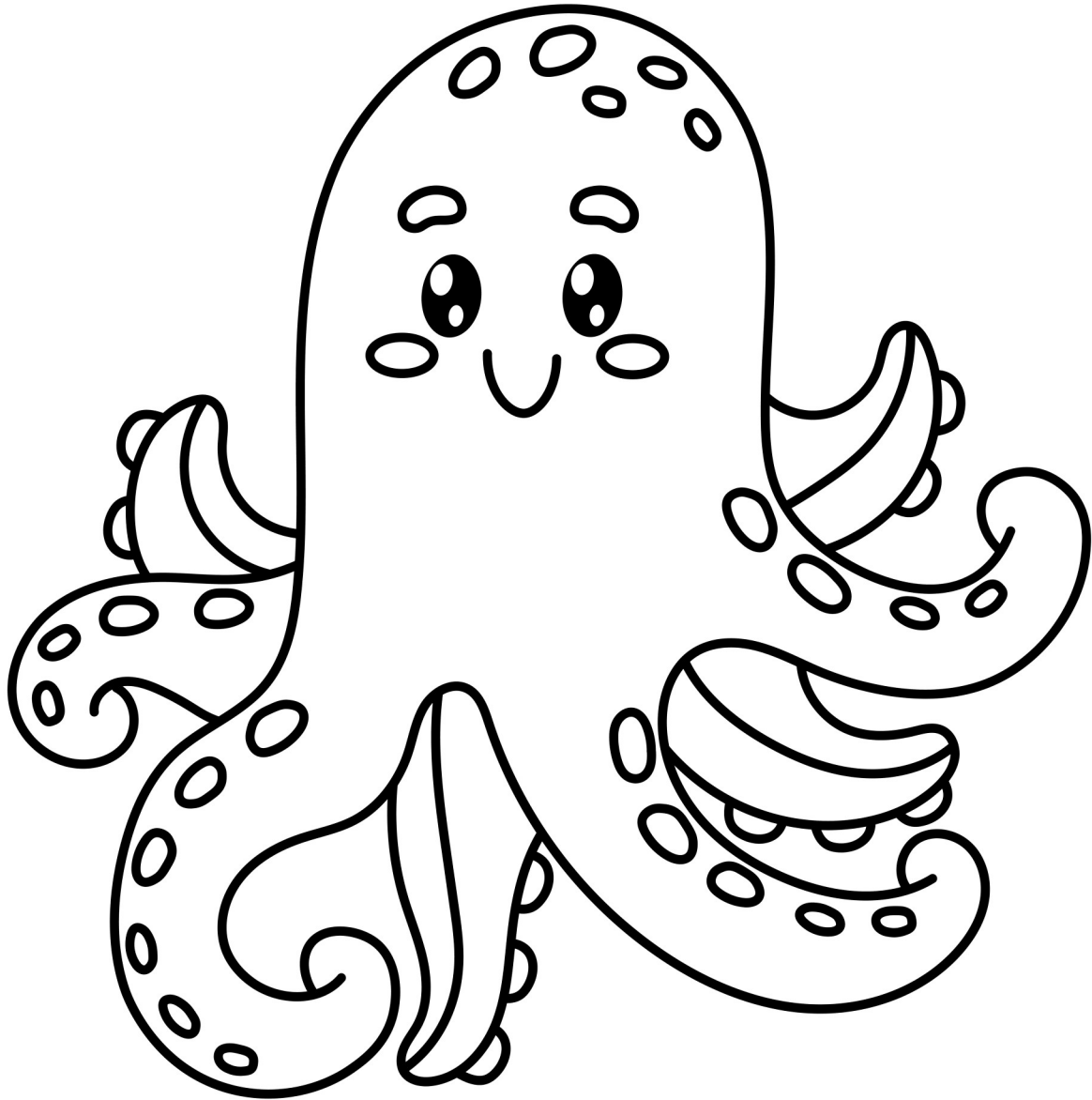


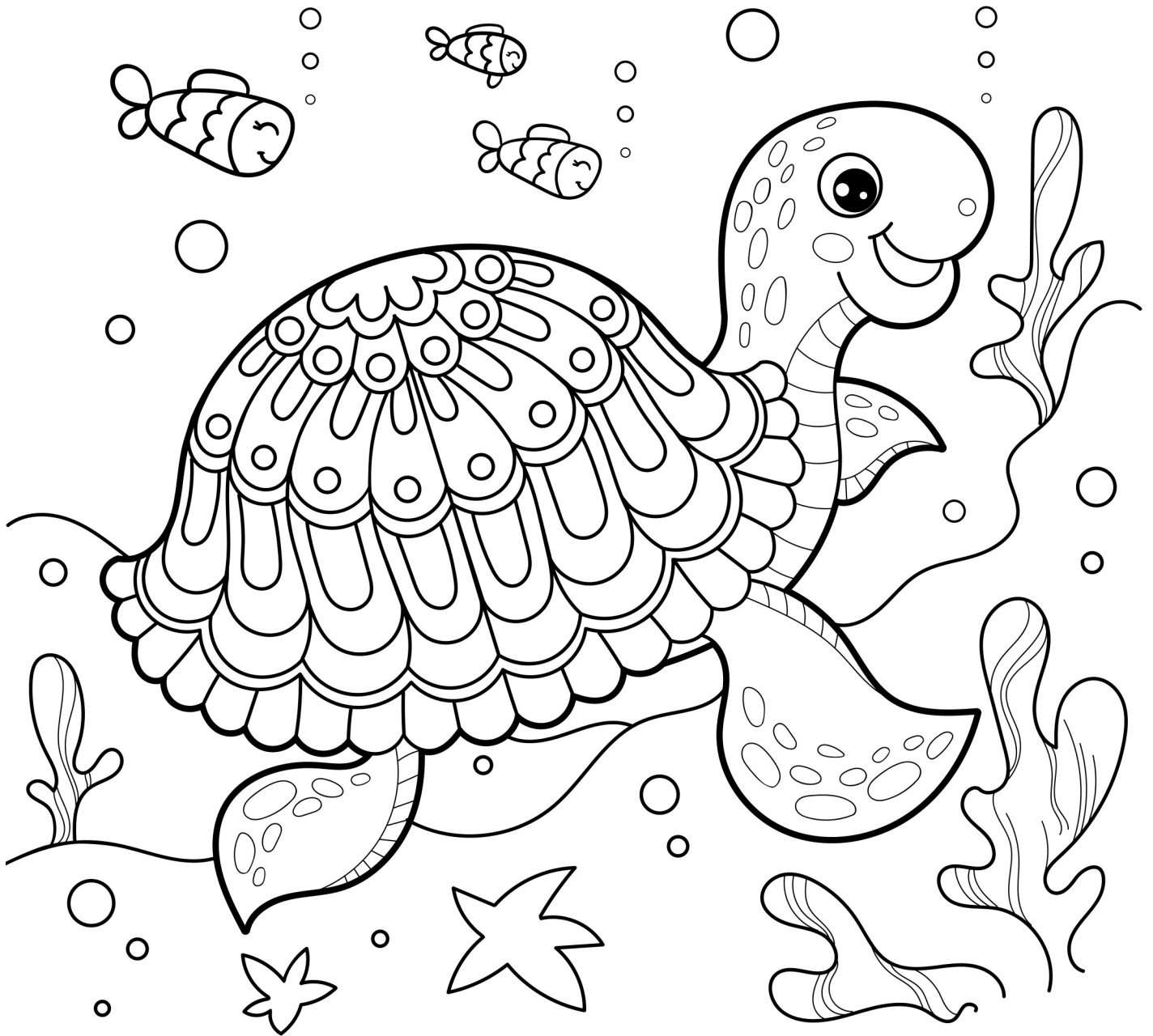

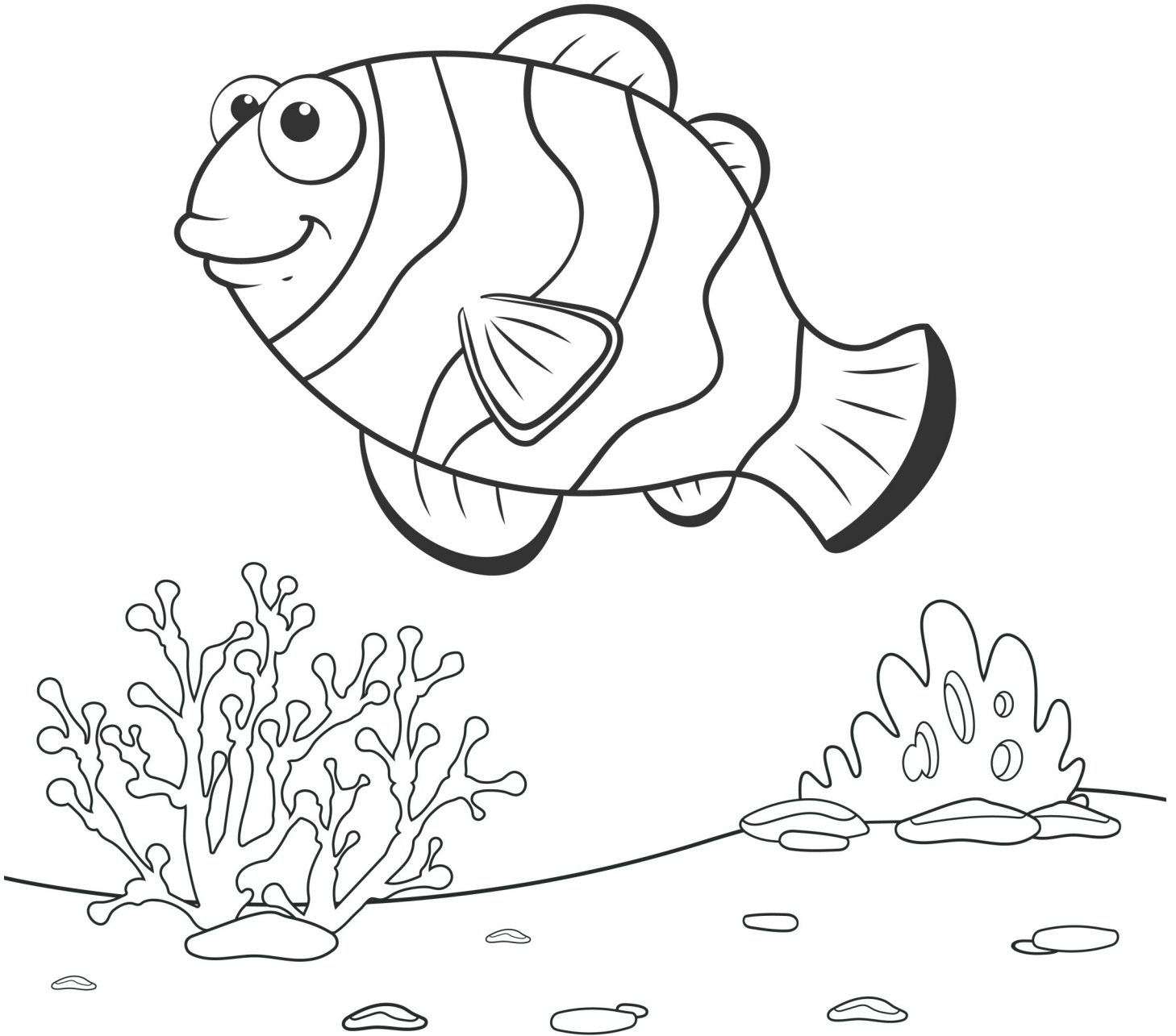

One Little Red Fish

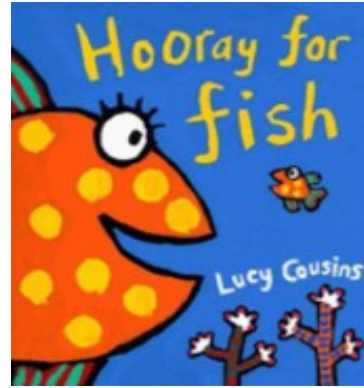
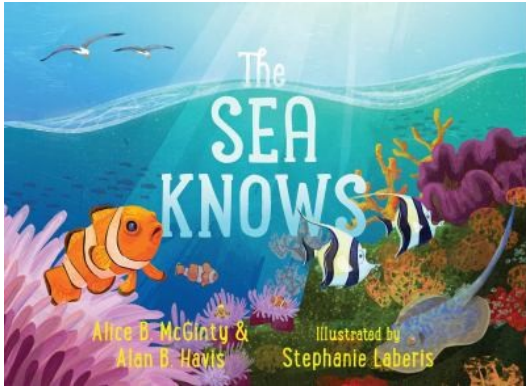

Repeat with different numbers and colors!



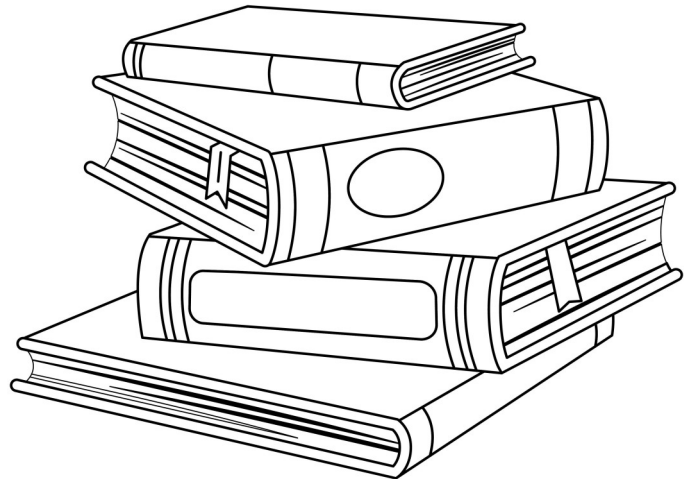
